#### **New Parish**

The new Loose Parish expands in May from 1000 to 3000 homes, now incorporating the former North Loose Residents Association (NLRA) area. The boundary extends from Linton crossroads in the south to the Wheatsheaf junction in the north.

#### What will this mean?

Loose Parish Council (LPC) and its committees will now be overseeing a much larger geographical area and have the challenge of communicating their work, and being available to support the increased Parish population. We have already welcomed several new Councillors from the former NLRA area who bring a wealth of area knowledge.

We will continue to publish our update article in "In & Around Loose", and use our Loose Parish Council Facebook page for immediate information. We intend to increase the regularity of this Community Alert newsletter so want to increase our subscribers. Please advise friends and neighbours to sign up too.

# What does Loose Parish Council do?

LPC is organised into different committees that make decisions on key matters that affect Loose. These include planning and development issues, maintenance and protection of outdoor spaces and provision of community services.

LPC owns the Loose Pavilion, the King George V recreation ground and play areas and Brooks Field. Additionally, they look after the closed cemetery, the village green on Old Loose Hill, Richmond Way green and oversee the Loose allotments with the McAlpine Trust.

We report to Kent County Council on highway issues and Maidstone Borough Council on planning, parking, refuse and street care matters. Other partners include Kent Police through our local Beat Officer, the community warden service, local schools, community groups and organisations.

Residents can report issues directly via each organisation's website. However, if you need support doing so please contact us. If you are not sure who can help you with a particular issue or idea, again contact our office team for discussion and advice. We may be able to signpost you, or refer the matter to the relevant LPC committee to consider.
