#### Consultation Outcomes Parish Boundary changes

Following the Community Governance Review public consultation Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) have announced that there will be significant changes to the Loose Parish boundary. Hubbards Lane will join Boughton Monchelsea parish and the currently unparished North Loose Residents Association (NLRA) area (from Lancet Lane north to the Wheatsheaf pub) will join Loose Parish, increasing its size from approximately 1000 to 3000 homes.

The larger Parish will give Loose strength and a weightier voice on MBC and KCC matters such as planning, highways and community development. It will also give greater protection to the former NLRA area which has always relied on the highly admirable volunteer force led by Sean Carter, who openly admits they are an "ageing force" with many people, quite understandably wishing to step back. With a lack of new volunteers coming forward, bringing the area under the Parish will enable NLRA owned amenities and projects to be managed and maintained along with those in the existing Parish. Households will pay a precept on their Council Tax, but the voluntary NLRA membership will no longer exist. Whilst still in the early days of merger discussions and budget planning, LPC are aware of the cost of living issues and will keep the precept to the minimum to cover required costs. Those in the existing Parish should see a reduction on what they

currently pay as the budget requirements will be spread between many more homes.

What is extremely important to LPC is that there are representatives from across the whole new Parish on the Council. We hope some of the amazing NLRA team will continue to volunteer as their expertise on the NLRA area will be invaluable. But now is the perfect time for anyone else to get involved too. So if you care about what you see and hear going on in and around the Loose community, and want to play a real part in making decisions that shape and protect where you live, why not get involved?

We need new recruits to join our current volunteers who attend Parish Council and Committee meetings, discussing and making key decisions for Loose. We would also welcome anyone who would like to volunteer for any of our practical working parties, helping keep Loose looking great (as the recent pond working party certainly did!) The only qualification you need is to CARE about your local area and the main resource is a little of your time.

#### 20mph zone consultation outcome

In June the Council consulted all existing Parish households on a 20mph scheme that some residents wished to see put in place on designated roads in the village. As it had a significant cost, and the proposal was not supported by KCC Highways, it would have to funded by an increase in the precept. LPC therefore had to seek the views of all Parish residents. Results were as follows: 54.4% against, 43.4% in favour and 2.2% undecided. As there was no majority support, LPC will not be taking it forward or using Parish precept fund.

Some members of Loose Amenities Association (LAA) and residents who live in or around the identified zone requested a
