Help for Households

The parish council is extremely aware of how difficult the cost of living is proving to be for some local residents and are trying to do their bit to help. There have been two major areas where councillors have decided not to increase costs for residents.

Firstly, the Parish Precept (the amount residents pay to the Borough Council for local services in Loose parish). For 2023-2024 this will remain frozen at 2022-2023 rates. This means no increase for residents from last year, with the Parish Precept for 2023-24 being £106,833. The Band D rate will be £93.87 per annum.

Secondly, Loose Parish Pavilion and King

George V Playing Field hire rates. As well as being home to the parish council, and various community groups, facilities are also available for hire to the general public, sports clubs, businesses, community and charity organisations.

For the second financial year running, Loose Parish Council has frozen the hire fees at 2019-2020 rates. The tariff of charges is on the parish council website.

Personalised Care & Social Prescribing at the

Greensand Health Centre, Linton At the February main meeting of Loose Parish Council, a representative from Greensand Health Centre, Linton, came to speak about the work they are doing at the Centre and how people can find support, through various activities they run.

She explained that Greensand Health Centre, Linton now have a dedicated Social Prescribing Team.

Many things can affect people's health and wellbeing. GPs say that a lot of people visit them feeling isolated or lonely. Or they might

be stressed out by work, money and housing problems. Sometimes it's the stress of managing different long-term conditions.

A Social Prescribing Link Worker is somebody who will work with a person on a one-to-one basis, to listen to what really matters to them, and to then help put them in touch with the right people and activities that can help them to feel better.

As part of their work, a number of free support and social groups, for the community to access and enjoy, have been set up.

These are all free of charge and open to all local residents and patients. They take place at Greensand Health Centre, Heath Road, Linton ME17 4NU.

Greensand Book Club

Every Wednesday from 11am -1pm. Share your latest read, discuss and inspire others or just listen. Books provided.

Greensand Knit and Natter Social Group

Every Thursday from 10am -12 noon. All ages and abilities welcome. Needles, wool and patterns provided, or bring along your own projects and see what others are working on. It's a great way to get inspired, pick-up tips and make new friends.

Greensand Games Club

Every Monday from 11am -1pm. Play a board game and get to know your opponents! Games provided.

Veterans Support Group

Meets the first Tuesday of each month between 11-1pm, at the Greenery Café at Greensand Health Centre, Mutual support, comradeship and great coffee & cake!

Addiction Support

Support group meets every third Thursday or Friday of each month, between 1-2.30pm. Are you or someone you care about misusing drugs or alcohol? Here to listen if people want to talk. Can provide information on what support is available for individuals and their families.

At all of the above groups, The Greenery Cafe will be open serving drinks, snacks and cake.
